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Lean Champions: 5S and Kaizen Competition



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1. Challenges



Our observations during the last 10 years:

- inconsistency on the part of senior management in its support for Lean initiatives
- Low employee commitment and lack of motivation to change
- Lack of a well-built strategy for the development of the relevant production in the direction of improving the company culture, through Lean transformation
- insufficient knowledge and skills of employees to implement improvements with lasting results



The main idea is that the competition will contribute to the effective promotion of continuous improvement and employee engagement in each plant.

2. Participantion



All plants, who wish to participate, regardless of the size and type of industry:

- 5S is applicable to any type of industry and is an excellent basis for Kaizen
 - Plants that are in the early stages receive training, implementation strategy and consulting
 - Advanced plants will be audited against a standard audit sheet and will receive guidance on how to maintain what has been achieved and gradually upgrade
- **Kaizen** in each plant, a theme for improvement will be chosen. According to the theme, all participants will receive training and consultation on a methodology, which is carried out step by step. We have 50 different methodologies that cover every aspect of a company's performance as:
 - Machinery-related losses
 - Improving information and material flows
 - Development of new products and equipment
 - Improvement of business processes



Lean has a beginning, but no end! Continuous improvements cannot end.

3. Goals



- Promoting the implementation of the 5S and Kaizen principles
- Improvement of production processes and working environment
- Increase employee engagement and motivation
- Sharing good practices and experience between factories
- Organization of visits between factories that wish
- Continuous pursuit of continuous improvement
- Improving company culture




Creating a unified Lean community, which helps and develops. The competition is just for extra motivation.

4. Benefits for the participants



The benefits will constantly increase. Here is some of them:

- Maintaining a constant interest in continuous improvements
- Regular exchange of experience between Lean professionals by organizing regular online and live meetings once a quarter
- Available consultancy service at regular intervals (once a month) throughout the year
- Recognition by international experts for achieved results
- A new worldview and development strategy through Lean and Six Sigma



The continuous increase in benefits will come from solving each specific case in each production.

5. Rules



The rules of the game will be constantly evolving:

- The competition starts at the beginning of each year
- Factories that want to participate must register before the new year begins
- Consultants from Lean Bulgaria Ltd. visit each plant 1 day every month
- One zone per plant is selected per quarter, in which 5S and Kaizen will be implemented
- Every quarter, a temporary ranking of the plants is prepared. 2 criteria are evaluated 5S and Kaizen
- Ten of the plants with the best results in a year are ranked at an annual evaluation.
- At the end of each year, the 10 best plants present their achievements at an Annual Ceremony in front of representatives of all other plants
- The winner is determined at the Annual Ceremony after voting by all attendees and evaluating by a jury with extensive international experience in Lean.
- New plants can sign up for participation in the competition after the start of the relevant year, but will be
 evaluated the following year

The rules for the competition can be changed once a year, after voting by all participants during the Annual Ceremony.

6. Awards for the winners



Prizes for 1st place

- Specially made cup for "Lean Champions: 5S and Kaizen competition " with the name of the plant
- Removal of the monthly fee for a period of one year
- Cash prize of 10% of the annual fees of all plants

Prizes for 2nd place

- Specially made cup for "Lean Champions: 5S and Kaizen competition " with the name of the plant
- Reduction of the monthly fee by 50% for a period of one year

Prizes for 3rd place

- Specially made cup for "Lean Champions: 5S and Kaizen competition " with the name of the plant
- Reduction of the monthly fee by 25% for a period of one year

All participants can receive an International Certificate "Certified Lean Practitioner" from ILSSI (International Lean Six Sigma Institute) after successfully passing an exam.

7. Monthly fee



Each participant signs a contract for participation:

- 1000 BGN without VAT
- Registration for participation https://lean.bg/lean-champions-5s-i-kayzen-sastezanie/
- Participants registering in 2025 are full members, but do not only participate in the final annual evaluation



The fee is paid upon receipt of a tax invoice at the beginning of each month.

8. International Jury



The international jury participates only in the Annual Evaluation.
